

Know all men by these presents that I Adam Indian of the Town & County of New Haven in the Colony of Conecticut For the Love Good will & Efection which I have and Do bare to my Loveing Son Samuel Adam Do Give & Grant to him the halfe part of four Acres of Land and the half part of one dwelling Houfe Said Houfe & Land Lying and being in the Township of Farmington in the Colony aforefaid it being a peace of Land I Bought of a Squaw Called ~~Sue Squaw~~ Sew Wois Lies in ~~the~~ an Indian field weft of Said Farmington y^e s^d Land have =ing an orchard and fruit trees Standing thereon Said Land. As Bounded on the Eaft by ~~the~~ ^ a Highway Weft North & South by Indian Land To Have & to Hold the aforefaid Half part of Houfe and Land with all the appurtinances to him my afores^d
